4.) First aid measures

General information

In case of persisting adverse effects, consult a physician. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes immediately, and launder thoroughly before reusing.

After inhalation

Remove affected person from the immediate area. Ensure supply of fresh air.

After skin contact

Wash off immediately with soap and water. Do NOT use solvents or thinners !

After eye contact

Separate eyelids, wash the eyes thoroughly with water (15 min.). Seek medical assistance.

After ingestion

Do not induce vomiting. Summon a doctor immediately. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

5.) Fire-fighting measures

Suitable extinguishing media

Alcohol-resistant foam; extinguishing powder; Carbon dioxide; Water spray jet

Extinguishing media that must not be used for safety reasons

Full water jet

Special exposure hazards arising from the substance or preparation itself, combustion products, resulting gases

In the event of fire, the following can be released: Carbon dioxide (CO₂); Carbon monoxide (CO)

Special protective equipment for fire-fighters

Use self-contained breathing apparatus. Wear protective clothing.

Other information

Cool endangered containers with water spray jet. Suppress gases/vapours/mists with water spray jet.

6.) Accidental release measures

Personal precautions

Refer to protective measures listed in sections 7 and 8. Ensure adequate ventilation. Keep away sources of ignition. Do not inhale vapours. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing.

Environmental precautions

Do not discharge into the drains/surface waters/groundwater.

Methods for cleaning up/taking up

Take up with absorbent material (e.g., sand, kieselguhr, universal binder). Send in suitable containers for recovery or disposal.

7.) Handling and storage

Handling

Advice on safe handling

Provide good ventilation of working area (local exhaust ventilation, if necessary). If workplace exposure limits are exceeded, respiratory protection approved for this particular job must be worn. Product

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inherent handling risks must be minimised taking the appropriate measures for protection and preventive actions. The working process should be designed to rule out the release of hazardous substances or skin contact as far it is possible by the state of the art.

Advice on protection against fire and explosion

Vapours can form an explosive mixture with air. Take precautionary measures against static charges. Keep away from sources of heat and ignition.

Storage

Requirements for storage rooms and vessels

Containers which are opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Always keep in containers of same material as the original one.

Advice on storage assembly

Keep container tightly closed and dry in a cool, well-ventilated place. Protect from heat and direct sunlight.

Personal protective equipment

Respiratory protection

If workplace exposure limits are exceeded, a respiration protection approved for this particular job must be worn. In case of aerosol and mist formation, take appropriate measures for breathing protection in the event workplace threshold values are not specified.

Hand protection

Sufficient protection is given wearing suitable protective gloves checked according to i.e. EN 374, in the event of risk of skin contact with the product .
